



Class R really loved exploring Forest School for the first time today.



As part of learning about Living Things in their Habitats in Science, Class 4 have taken to going and exploring creatures in their local habitat. Equipped with bug viewers, binoculars, magnifying glasses and iPads, the children took to the outside world to observe and record their findings. Observational diagrams were drawn and detailed notes about the conditions of the environment were also made.



This brought up a few interesting questions. We wondered why is it that worms prefer dark and damp places? Why are wasps and bees, however, attracted to the warmer and brighter surroundings? We brought all our findings together and totalled our sightings, which led to some interesting discussions. Despite being able to identify crane flies and some other less familiar, insects some of the different leaves and branches had us stumped, but we soon identified these after a quick referral to resources and identification keys.




Hever Triathlon

Pupil Premium

If your family has experienced considerable change in circumstance, you may be entitled to apply for **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium**.

The criteria for successful application include:

- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

The application process must be completed by parents; The additional benefit to successful FSM applications, is that the school will receive **Pupil Premium Funds** to support a child's well-being and development in school.

Update September 2021: The Government have announced that they will issue <u>additional</u> Recovery Premium funding to support children entitled to Pupil Premium 2021-22. Please check the above criteria carefully, to see if it is applicable to your family's situation. These funds are vital for additional support for children.

The grand re-opening of Chevening's Lending Library!

Just before we went into lockdown, Mr Garrett, the caretaker at Chevening, made a lending library. A lending library is a small box to store books in. The purpose of it is so that if you have read a fabulous book and you think you want to read it again then you hand it in to our Lending Library for other people to enjoy.

These are some quotes from people around Key Stage 2 about how they like the Lending Library. Isla (Class 3) said "I like that there are so many different books to choose from". Mrs Holdak, a teaching assistant at Chevening, said "I love seeing children choose their books from our lending library". Emmy (Year 5) said "I like that there are lots of choices of book".

A few key things about our Lending Library are:

- You should only ever access it with an adult so that you can be supervised in making your choice,
- make sure the door is closed after use
- the Lending Library should only be used by **Key Stage 2** children.
- Remind your children to bring in lots of books to share in Key Stage 2!

All of Chevening loves our Lending Library, we hope we see lots more exciting books in there soon!
