#### **Pupil Premium**

If your family has experienced considerable change in circumstance, you may be entitled to apply for **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium.** 

The criteria for successful application include:

- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

You can apply on-line here.

The application process must be completed by parents; The additional benefit to successful FSM applications, is that the school will receive **Pupil Premium Funds** to support a child's well-being and development in school.

Update September 2021: The Government have announced this week that they will issue <u>additional</u> Recovery Premium funding to support children entitled to Pupil Premium 2021-22. <u>Please check the above criteria carefully, to see if it is applicable to your family's situation.</u> These funds are vital for additional support for children.
