Dear Parents/Carers,

It's been lovely to welcome everyone back to a warm and mostly sunshine-y week. The positives have included welcoming Skyla-Lily to our school, two successful Class trips, Class 6 Bikeability training and the first week of Swimming!

Sadly, I do have to report some negatives as well; there was an overnight break-in on Wednesday, resulted in damage and theft of the automatic gate mechanism on the driveway. This leaves our site vulnerable to intruders during the day, so swift additional measures have been put in place, with CCTV footage reported to the Police to aid their enquiries.

Once again, with difficulties on the motorways, there were some dangerous moments on the way to school, especially on Thursday morning. Drivers speeding through the village are a great concern, particularly when they use the pavements as additional road space.

Please ensure your child knows how to stay safe in difficult and dangerous situations!

Please do not add to the difficulties and dangers by parking on the zig-zag and double yellow lines around the entrances.

We do hope that the on-going COVID restrictions for schools may be eased with the Prime Minister's announcement next Monday. Until then, we continue to maintain our COVID-secure operating measures. Class 5 (Mr Qureshi)- Isla and Sophie for compassion and respect in sharing with us the work of some charities that they are passionate about.


Class 6 (Mrs Edwards) - Lily for having a respectful attitude and behaviour during Bikeability this week.

in with studying the Amazon, thanks to the <u>RHS</u>. They also explored Amazing Oceans with the <u>Incredible Oceans TV</u> Team.



Pupil Premium

If your family has experienced considerable change in circumstance due to COVID-19, you may be entitled to apply for **Free School Meals** and **Pupil Premium.** The criteria for successful application include:

- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

You can apply on-line here.

The application process must be completed by parents. The additional benefit to successful FSM applications, is that the school will receive **Pupil Premium Funds** to support a child's well-being and development in school.
