COVID-19 Symptom Free Testing

Kent are advising that everyone <u>without</u> Covid symptoms should get tested every 2 weeks, if they leave the house for a necessary reason, such as going to work or shopping for essentials. 1 in 3 people have COVID-19 but do not show any of the main symptoms, so regular testing will help to ensure people are not unknowingly spreading the virus. Symptom Free Testing for Chevening Staff

NHS Test and Trace Lateral Flow Device (LFD) have been delivered to the school and testing will commence for staff next week.

For children attending school, this means that in the event that a member of staff reports a positive result, their close contacts will be asked to isolate AND the relevant bubble will be closed for isolation. If the subsequent PCR test confirms the *positive result*, then the Bubble will remain closed for isolation for 10 days. Should the PCR test confirm a *negative result*, then both Bubble and close contacts can return to site.

Temporary Road Closure— Chevening Road, 13-20th February 2021


We have been asked to alert parents/carers about these proposed roadworks:

Class 1

All the children were very excited this week to begin our new book, 'Leaf', by Sandra Dieckmann. They have only read the first few pages, but have already created a fact-file about polar bears; a job that we all enjoyed.

Here are some fascinating facts that we now know:

- -A polar bear can smell a seal at a distance of 1.6km!
- -There are only about 20,000 polar bears in the wild.

The most surprising thing that we found out though, was that polar bears actually have black skin underneath all that lovely fluffy white fur.

The children have been reading Antonia Barber's book, The Mousehole Cat. In the story, the cat Mowzer sings to the Storm-Cat in order to calm her down, so that she and her owner can catch some fish! 

On site reminders

Please could parents/carers remember:

- -The children need **coats and wellies** to school every day and waterproofs for when it rains

Pupil Premium

If your family has experienced considerable change in circumstance due to COVID-19, you may be entitled to apply for **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium.** The criteria for successful application include:

- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16.190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

You can apply on-line here.

The application process must be completed by parents; The additional benefit to successful FSM applications, is that the school will receive **Pupil Premium Funds** to support a child's well-being and development in school.

Update on EMC/Activ8 in Term

A reminder from last week:

- Payments are paused for existing fixed EMC/A8 sessions where they are not currently required.
- where there is no demand for the service, EMC and A8 staff have been given flexible furlough.
- Where critical worker parents/carers still need sessions and book places in advance, the clubs will be available. However with low and sporadic need, we may not always be able to offer emergency care on days that have no bookings for that session.
- 48 hours' notice must be given for session changes to enable staffing to be confirmed. Cancelled sessions with less than 48 hours' notice will still be charged.
- This process will run until there is significant change in National and/or local restrictions.
 Once normality returns and school is open to all children, we will try to check if parents/ carers are still needing their original pattern of provision, so that the sessions will be

Leo ventured out on a frosty morning for his PE Lesson and wrote his name on the grass!




