RNIB Used Stamps

We are collecting postage stamps (new or used, first or second class, foreign, first day covers, presentation packs or albums) to help the blind and partially sighted people on behalf of RNIB.

Each school bubble has their own collection box to start collecting the stamps. Stamps are sold by weight and we can raise £20 per kg of stamps, so it's a brilliant way to fundraise for RNIB.



Remote Learning Update

Classes 3, 4, 5 & 6 have learnt the basics of Microsoft Teams this term, as a way of safely communicating and learning, if needing to isolate from school. Using Teams in this way, along side secure emails and the school website will be our basic approach for remote learning for our older children. Our plans still reflect the fact that it is not possible for all learning to be posted online, as not all our families are able to provide continuous access at home.

For our younger children, we recognise that Teams will be more useful for safely keeping in touch if individuals/Bubbles need to isolate at home; for **Classes R, 1 and 2,** the school website will host teaching & learning opportunities, which will not always need to be on-line.

Should the need arise, more details will be shared. In the meantime, our **Remote Education Policy** can be accessed <u>here</u>. The exact circumstances of an individual/group needing to isolate will determine the provision available, which will be confirmed by the school when a child/group move to isolation at home.

Chevening's Whole-School Christmas Celebration




Parents/carers will receive separate email with links and instructions, so they can enjoy the film at home.
