Some reminders to keep us all safe:


- Siblings/household members who need to <u>self-isolate</u> must **NOT** come onto school site.


Class R

Class R have been learning about 2D shapes in Maths. They particularly enjoyed creating their own 2D shape pictures. Can you spot what each picture is?




Class 4

Lakeland Lapland Festive Virtual Ultra Run

Chevening are taking part in the Lakeland Lapland Festive Virtual Ultra Run between the 10th and the 17th December. We are going to pause our Daily Mile Destinations adventure, where we have been racing round the world, in order to race to Santa! The children (in teams of KS1, LKS2 and UKS2) will be running 234km (145 miles) in their teams over 6 days. The city of Rovaniemi is the capital of Lapland and to get to Santa, you have to travel 234k to the village of Korvatunturi. We will be tracking our progress daily with live updates! As well as the run, the children will be reading 'The Fox & The Reindeer' who made the 145 miles journey across Lapland, overcoming adversity, to save Christmas.

Reminders

Please could parents/carers remember:

- -If your **child is unwell** & has **ANY** COVID-19 symptoms, they **cannot** attend school—please seek advice from NHS 111.
- To wear a face covering when dropping off and collecting you child from school, unless you are exempt.
- -The children need **coats and wellies** to school every day
- -To **closely supervise** children coming in/going out of school (*unless Class 6 have been authorised to walk home*). Please do not allow children to play together while waiting at the start/end of day, as we need to keep each separate Bubble consistent!
- -Your child can wear a **plain fleece** on top of their existing school uniform to help them stay warm;


