

Class Attendance

School Lunches

Please could you ensure that you cancel your child's lunch if they are absent. If the catering company sends a meal to the School for your absent children, the School will be charged for all child eligible for free school meals (including children in Key Stage 1). Key Stage 2 children, the amount will also be charged to your child's account.

Lateness

Please remember that drop off for the school day is between 8.35am - 8.55am every morning. Please ensure that your children arrives in school by 8.55am. Any child who arrives late will need to report to the School Office. The class registers will close at 9.05am so any children arriving after this time will be marked as late.

Wellbeing

As we approach the Christmas and New Year period, I wanted to take this opportunity to make you aware that Kooth is free & available to young people aged **10-16**.

Kooth is free online counselling and emotional wellbeing support service for children and young people. Children/Young people can be signposted to Kooth or can sign up themselves to access free and safe online mental health and wellbeing support, so no referral is required.

The online counselling is provided by a professional team of qualified counsellors and emotional wellbeing practitioners. Alongside the counselling, there are other online tools and features they can use, such as a daily journal, mini activities and Kooth's magazine, with peer to peer and community elements. All of these are safe, secure, pre moderated and age appropriate.

When is Kooth available:

-online support tools and features are available at any time, 365 days a year. (including Christmas Day)

- online counselling 12pm -10pm during the week and at the weekend from 6pm to 10pm, 365 days a year (including Christmas Day)
