Class 3 (Mrs Roll) - Alice for showing perseverance for always trying hard, even when she finds the work difficult.


Class 4 (Miss Sweeney) - Lawrie for showing courage for having a brilliant first week at Chevening and settling so well into Class 4.

## Please could parents/carers remember:

## **Class Attendance**

Regular and punctual attendance ensures that everyone benefits from all that is on offer in school—socially, emotionally and academically, now and into the future. Punctuality & Attendance have been brilliant—please keep it up!

Attendance and absence are closely monitored each day, so staff notice concerns and successes, even during COVID. The Government have said that absence for reasons linked to COVID Guidance will not impact children's attendance rates. We inform parents/carers of their child's attendance routinely, especially if absence impacts learning.
