Pupil Premium

If your family has experienced considerable change in circumstance due to COVID-19, you may be entitled to apply for **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium.** The criteria for successful application include:

• Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

• Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

The application process must be completed by parents; The additional benefit to successful FSM applications, is that the school will receive **Pupil Premium Funds** to support a child's well-being

Reminders

-If your **child is unwell** & has **ANY** COVID-19 symptoms, they *cannot* attend school—please seek advice from NHS 111.

Families who have travelled outside of the UK will need to check the Government's requirements for **self-isolation on return**.

Any staff member or child returning from a country that requires a period of self-isolation, can only return to school when the quarantine period has been completed. Class Attendance
