Well-being


The impact of COVID on our children has been a huge concern and we recognise that coming back to school will help well-being for some, but not necessarily all families. In view of this and other issues and anxieties that our children face, we will continue to signpost useful tips, ideas and resources for our families. If you need to talk to a member of staff, please do so; your child's class teacher is a sensible person to start with, but other options include: Mrs Caisley (SENCo), Miss Minnis (Headteacher) or Mrs McLean (Deputy Headteacher) - all three are Safeguarding Leads in the school. Good well-being is a pre-requisite for good learning, so we take concerns seriously. In class this week we have been looking at our bodies in Science. The children all had to draw themselves and label as many parts as they could. We practiced naming all the parts by playing Simon Says.



We have also continued to work on our Geography topic of the UK. We noted down the information that we already know about the UK as a whole and then looked more closely at Scotland - first country in our journey around the UK. We listened to bagpipes and drew the flag before designing our own tartans. In a Scottish tartan colours are included that have special meanings, so we had to explain why we had chosen certain colours for our own designs.

Barnardo's 'See, Hear, Respond' service

See, Hear, Respond is a service that provides support to children, young people and their families who are not currently seeing a social worker or other agency, and who are struggling to cope with the emotional impacts of COVID-19. See, Hear, Respond will support from pre-birth up to 18 years of age and those with special educational needs under the age of 25.

See, Hear, Responds will contact every referral made, so no child is missed. Help is available in one of more of four ways:

-an online hub of support and information

- online counselling and therapy

- face to face support for those most affected and at risk of some of today's most pertinent issues, such as criminal exploitation.

- helping children and young people reintegrate back into school

School Lunches

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Pupil Premium

If your family has experienced considerable change in circumstance due to COVID-19, you may be entitled to apply for **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium.** The criteria for successful application include:

• Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

- Income Suppor
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance

• support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

• the guaranteed element of Pension Credit

• Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

• Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

You can apply on-line here.

The application process must be completed by parents; The additional benefit to successful FSM applications, is that the school will receive **Pupil Premium Funds** to support a child's well-being and development in school.
