Pupil Premium

If your family has experienced considerable change in circumstance due to COVID-19, you may be entitled to apply for **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium.** The criteria for successful application include:

- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

You can apply on-line here.

The application process must be completed by parents; The additional benefit to successful FSM applications, is that the school will receive **Pupil Premium Funds** to support a child's well-being and development in school.

Virtual Parents/Teacher Appointments for Classes 1-6

Please note the two dates that staff will be hosting virtual individual appointments with parents/carers, most likely via Zoom, on **Mon 28th and Tues 29th September.**

These are much earlier in the year than usual, but we hope they will support parents and teachers in discussing how each child is settling into class and adjusting to new COVID-19 systems. Well-being and approaches to learning will be the focus of the 10 minute appointments, rather than academic progress.
