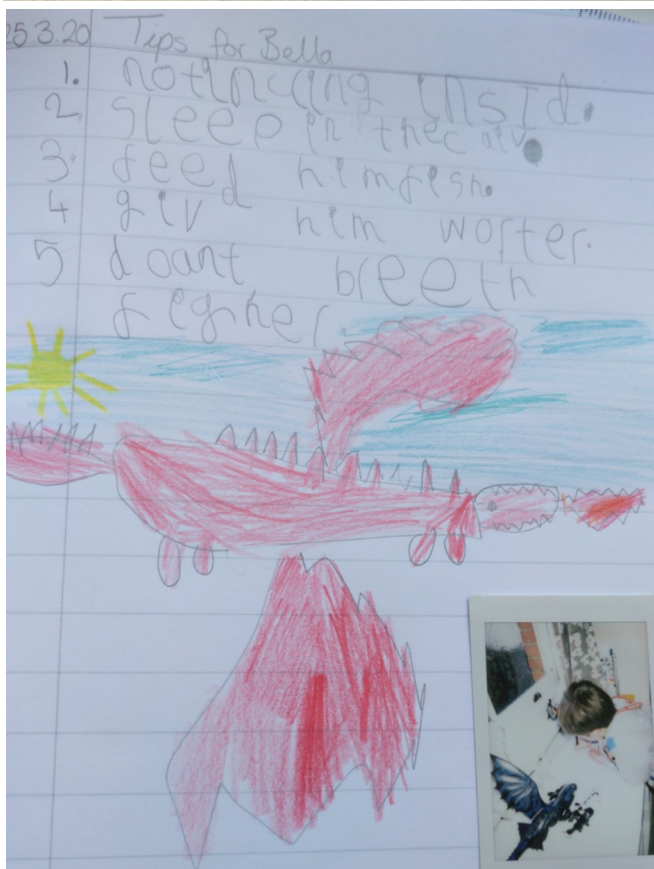
Christian Values
