Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you to everyone for supporting the school during this week's OFSTED inspection on Tuesday and Wednesday. The inspectors were able to meet, listen to and involve many children, staff, governors and parents. The inspectors have asked me to pass on their particular thanks to you all for your professionalism, accommodation and care, which enabled them to carry out their tasks and duties. We are particularly proud of the way that the children conducted themselves in school this week, when at times, their normal routines were quite disrupted.

The inspection was thorough and rigorous; the school family's willingness to give our best and share all that is at the heart of Chevening enabled the inspectors to see our school as it is. We now await the final report, which will take approximately 25 working days, allowing for full quality assurance processes to be completed. Once the report arrives, we will share it with all our families and it will also be posted on the school website.

Looking ahead, we will aim to re-schedule the postponed Thursday's Reading Workshop to **Monday, 16th December**. We do hope this won't be too difficult for parents/carers who wanted to attend.

Next week is the start of Advent. We will be spending time with KS1 and KS2 children relooking at our Christian Values in different activities. Being familiar and confident in identifying the values that underpin our Chevening School family are important as we prepare for Christmas. More details next week!

Regular and punctual attendance ensures that everyone benefits from all that is on offer in school socially, emotionally and academically, now and into the future.


Did you know that if a child is late to school just 5 minutes every day this adds up to over 3 days lost learning each year.

3 tips to help start the conversation


1. Explore sites and apps together and talk about any concerns.
