Class 4 were inspired by our beautiful class book 'Belonging' by Jeannie Baker. We have been busy all week finding areas of the school grounds that Class 4 feel need improving.

On Monday, each group then bravely stood in front of the class and shared their thoughts and ideas about their chosen area. This led to some great persuasive writing. As a class they voted on which project they felt they should start with. And the winner is: Mini Playground Restoration Project!

Next week, Class 4 will begin their mini renovation project. They hope to create a space that will be enjoyed by the whole school community and evolve over time.

Class 4 would like to raise some funds to buy some key items. They will be hosting a cake sale on Tuesday the 24th September at 2:30pm. Each class (accompanied by their

class teacher) will be invited to our 'Bake Off' tent (classroom) where they will be able to purchase 3 cakes for £1. (There will be an egg free option). All profits made will go to the Kent Wildlife Trust. I do hope you are able to support Class 4 with this exciting project.



World Mental Health Day Thursday, 10th October



Chevening Primary School is pleased to support World Mental Health Day on Thursday, 10th October. We invite everyone (staff, pupils, parents) to raise awareness of the importance of good mental health by wearing a yellow accessory (socks, hairband, tie) with their regular school uniform. We ask for a donation of £1 with all proceeds donated to the Young Minds charity.

Free School Meals

If you receive certain benefits, the school can also get some additional money to support your child's learning. Its easy to apply for your child's free school meals online. Your eligibility will be checked and your application processed straight away. If your application is successful the school will be notified by email immediately and your child should start receiving their free school meal within 24 hours.

Who is eligible for free school meals?

Free school meals are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

Play Leaders

Seven Class 5 pupils went to Sevenoaks School on Monday afternoon to learn how to become sports leaders. They were taught how to apply 'STEP' (space, time, equipment, people) to different games in order to adapt them as required. Our sports leaders will be running intra-school competitions at lunchtimes. They will also be reporting our results to the Sevenoaks Sports Partnership for the inter school competitions.
