Summer Reading Challenge 2019

The Summer Reading Challenge 2019 with Kent Libraries began on 13 July and runs throughout the summer holidays, finishing on 14 September. It's aimed at children aged 4 to 11 and is completely free.

This year's theme is Space Chase, inspired by the 50th anniversary of the moon landing. Children are challenged to read 6 library books and are presented with a special medal and certificate at the end, collecting an exciting selection of space-themed rewards along the way.
