
Class 2 have been painting and drawing spring flowers, using watercolours and pastels.




Class 5 have started a new book in English this week: The Viewer by Shaun Tan. We have been doing some descriptive writing based on the vivid illustrations within the book.

Act of Worship

The theme for Act of Worship has returned to The Lord's Prayer this week. We discussed how difficult it is to 'hit the mark' of what God would want for us, as well as what to do when we don't manage. In fact, some of the children aimed paper aeroplanes to see if they could land next to God's word. A good try from the children, but all went adrift. Can you tell which lines of the Lord's Prayer we were thinking about?
