School Service this Sunday 4th February at 10:30am

This coming Sunday we are joining the congregation at St Botolph's Church for their morning worship. Our children will be taking part. Please could all children come wearing smart school uniform.

Book Week competition

The School Council is running a competition to tie in with Book Week and the Book Fair. They would like children to create a model of a book character or book setting inside a shoe box (on its side so that it can be seen). Please can the creations (clearly labelled with name and class) be brought into the school library on the morning of Monday 26th February where they will be displayed. The School Council will judge the competition and will announce a winner for KS1 and a winner for KS2 on Thursday 1st March. The prizes are vouchers to spend at the Book Fair

Pyjama day – Friday 9th February

Next Friday, two of our Year 6 pupils have organised a charity fundraising day to raise money for GOSH. All the children are invited to come to school wearing their PJs and bring £1 for this worthy charity. Please ensure that children's choice of pyjamas is appropriate for school in terms of coverage and warmth – obviously they need underwear and are welcome to wear additional layers underneath!

In addition, the Year 6 pupils have organised competitions for both KS1 and KS2. KS1 are invited to bring a teddy which they have dressed themselves. These need to be named with the children's names on and will be judged by Mr Garrett for the title of 'Best Dressed Teddy'. KS2 children have the chance to design their own PJS. They have all been given a sheet with a pyjama outline shape for drawing their designs. These will also be judged by Mr Garrett and in both key stages there are prizes for each class. Thank you to Chloe and Abbie Rae for all their hard work organising the event; it is great to see such independence and creativity.

Chevening School Judo Club

We are very excited to be arranging a new and slightly different sports club for the children. We are in the process of setting up the Chevening School Judo club, which will run before school once a week. Judo is a great sport for building self confidence, resilience and determination as well as being a fun way to maintain fitness and gain a new skill. The club is open to Year 2-6 in its first instance, although this could broaden to include all ages if there were sufficient interest. Depending on numbers, we envisage the cost being approximately £4 per session. Children will have the opportunity to attend 'gradings' to gain coloured belts and, as they progress, they will have access to competitions. If this is something your child would like to do, please register interest with the school office.

Digital Sunset Challenge

This week we had a visit from Councillor Anna Firth and her colleague Kelly Webb, who came to speak to the children about e-safety and health in respect of digital equipment they have access to at home.

The children have been challenged to switch off their devices a short while before bed and then leave them downstairs until the morning over a period of a week. Each child has been given a sheet on which they can record their data, a badge and a box. If they complete the challenge each night, they are invited to wear their badge on their school uniform the next day. If they did not complete the task, they should leave the badge in the box the following day and try again the next night. This Council run initiative coincides with e-safety week.

Lent Course - Simplify

Are you thinking of 'doing something' for Lent? The six weeks that runs up to Easter is often a good time to pause and reflect on how things are going in our lives and our walk with God. This year to help this process we are offering something to take up - a Lent Course. This will be based on a book by Bill Hybel's called Simplify. This is a practical Christian book aiming to help us 'declutter our souls' and simplify our lives. Its very readable and relevant. If you feel too busy and overwhelmed this is the book for you.

Lent begins on Valentine's Day and ends on April Fool's Day, which makes the dates easy to remember (this dating doesn't happen again for 73 years so enjoy it while you can!)
