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Book Week

Next week we will be holding our 'Book Week' which incorporates World Book day on Thursday 2nd March.

During the week there will be a host of different activities for the children to engage in and which will hopefully foster their love of reading and books. These will include a carousel of activities on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon where children will go to different classes for activities related to books, which have been specially chosen by the teachers.

On Thursday the whole school will be taking part in DEAR reading (Drop everything and read) where the bell will go at random points in the day and we will all stop what we are doing to read for a short period.

On Friday, the children will be dressing up. In Key Stage 1 there is a theme of Alice in Wonderland and in Key Stage 2 the children may choose any book character they like as inspiration for their costume.

There is also the favourite places to read display which Mrs Edwards emailed about earlier this week and the children will all receive their World Book Day voucher, which they will have the opportunity to spend at the book fair (See below).

It promises to be a lovely week full of exciting and enjoyable book related fun.

Swimming Pool Update

The school's governing body has unanimously agreed to refurbish our swimming pool so that it continues to meet health and safety standards and is ready to re-open in summer 2018. This will secure the pool as a long-term asset for the school and the future children of Chevening. Work will begin, we hope, soon after the end of the swimming season this year.

The decision is based on the recommendations of the working group of governors, staff and parents chaired by David Lewis. Many thanks to David, Joseph Devine, Jon Bowen, David Garrett, Louise Rutter, Lee Murphy and Riona Horley who all worked hard to ensure that the Governing Body was fully aware of all the available options. The next step will be a thorough tendering process and definition of requirements.

I can also announce that we have been blessed to receive an extremely generous donation of £100,000 from a member of St Botolph's Church towards the costs of this project - a wonderful expression of the strength of the relationship between our school and the local church community. This gives us great confidence that we can proceed with this important work and we are very grateful to the anonymous donor.
